Military Families to benefit from £3,000 of Childcare Support Serving personnel across the UK will be entitled to free wraparound childcare from September.

The <u>Wraparound Childcare (WAC) scheme</u> will provide up to 20 hours per week of free childcare before and after school during term time for eligible military parents with children aged 4 to 11 years.

Its roll-out follows successful trials at pilot sites around the country over the last two years and from the Autumn school term will be open to more than 20,000 children across the UK. While childcare costs vary across the UK, serving personnel are expected to save around £3,000 per child per year based on typical costs.

Neonatal Care (Leave and Pay) Bill

Thousands of parents whose babies require specialist care after birth will be able to take additional paid time off work, under new legislation backed by the government.

A baby who is born prematurely or sick will receive neonatal care in hospital or another agreed care setting – often for a prolonged period of time. This



can put parents in a difficult position of having to use their existing leave entitlements to be by their baby's side, or worse, having to return to work while their baby is still receiving hospital care.

<u>The Neonatal Care (Leave and Pay)</u> The Bill will allow parents to take up to 12 weeks of paid leave, in addition to other leave entitlements such as maternity and paternity leave, so that they can spend more time with their baby at what is a hugely stressful time.

Once in law, neonatal care leave will be available to employees from their first day in a new job and will apply to parents of babies who are admitted into hospital up to the age of 28 days, and who have a continuous stay in hospital of 7 full days or more.



Connect4communities
