Working Families - Flexible Working Bill

The *Flexible Working Bill* became law in July and from 2024 parents and carers have the right to request flexible working from day one of a job, and the right to request flexible working twice a year. Funded Early Years Education for 2-, 3- and 4-Years Olds

Government funded early years education places for <u>eligible 2-year-olds</u> and <u>all 3-and 4-year-olds</u> continue to be available. Early years education provides socialisation and support with learning and development for children through play; as well as enabling parents to care for others, study or train, work or volunteer, etc. Visit *Childcare Choices* for more information: https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/
